Deacon Jeff's Corner

As we enter this new year and look forward to what God has in store for us at Prince of Peace, I'd like to address an audience that probably does not read this corner, or even the bulletin as a whole: our individuals/families who are under 40. They are a vital segment of our parish, and hopefully will want to be involved even more in our activities here.

I hear all the time about how many offerings we have to participate in and how we have more and more young families joining the parish; If you are one of those individuals or families, I want you to know how valued you are and how much I would like to get to know you. The one thing I hear all the time is the lack of time, either due to work, family activities (sports, arts, etc.), and so many other things that simply don't allow you to be here. To this I can unequivocally say, "I have been there" with our sons as we raised them and got involved with all their activities. So let me hopefully offer some wisdom on this topic.

As our sons grew and got involved with school and sports, I would say we were faithful church goers, but really nothing more than that. We contributed financially to our parish, but certainly nothing out of our comfort zone. It was then that Mary and I discussed a topic I had heard from someone else: tithing, which is giving back 10% to God. Tithing is not only financially giving but also of your time. I thought the money side would really kill our household budget. I really had no time, but I got involved with lecturing, ushering and Communion distributing for starters. After one year, we found we had more money in the bank, things seemed to be calmer in the house, and we had more fun as a family than we ever had.

The next year, I got involved with the Finance Council at our parish. Our family served at the homeless shelter, and we watched our sons flourish in school, and in golf, where they ultimately won the State Championship in 2008. Both went on to play collegiately and earned degrees in mechanical engineering and pharmacy.

One hard fast rule we had as they were growing up was that nothing happened on Sunday without us going to Mass first. They had their choice between Mass at 8, 9:30 or 11. They chose 8:00 surprisingly and were up before 7 on Sunday mornings. Whatever happened after: golf, movies or anything else was ok, because we put God first.

If you are a younger person or have a young family, I cannot stress enough to include God in everything you do. I truly believe you will be shocked at what happens – in a good sense!

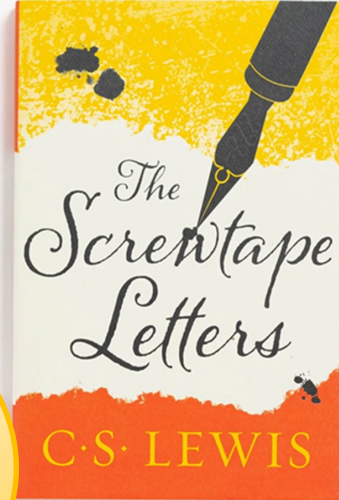

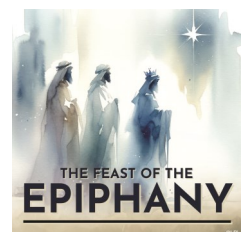

This weekend we celebrate Epiphany, commonly known as Three Kings Day. In some parts of the world this day makes Christmas pale in comparison. Most of what we know about the events of this feast come from Scripture but it's interesting that the myths and legends outweigh what the Bible tells us. For example, we really don't know how many visitors came to Jesus. The Bible tells of three gifts but not how many people brought them. Scripture speaks of the visit happening in a house but most of our Nativity sets have three guys in the stable. There is mention of the visitors being magi (literally magicians or what would call astrologers) and not kings. So what should we believe?

I think one of the most important things we can learn from this celebration is that, regardless of how many there were and what titles they held, these visitors had to travel a long distance and they did it because they learned that the long awaited King of the Jews had been born and they wanted, really needed, to show him the respect that was due to him. This day celebrates the idea that Jesus was sent, not only for the People of Israel, but for all people everywhere, regardless of how near or far they were from Bethlehem.

So these magi set out on a journey to find the fulfillment of the promise they had learned. What about us? How far are we willing to go to discover the presence of the Lord in our own lives? We get so wrapped up in the day to day stuff of life. Rightfully so, because we really do have needs and responsibilities, families to care for and jobs to do. But I think it would be good to ask ourselves if we're willing to make the journey it takes to discover the Lord who wants to be with us in these busy lives of ours.

We should bring a gift when we make the journey. I'm not sure Jesus wants gold and all that other fancy stuff. The best gift we can bring is the gift of ourselves, ready to recognize Jesus as Lord of our lives. I think we'll find it's worth the journey.



Baptism PREPARATION
