Deacon Jeff's Corner



My friends, we have a problem at Prince of Peace that is almost exclusive to us and no other parish in our entire Diocese of Green Bay. The problem: Mass intentions, or should I say the lack of availability of Mass intentions for a loved one. Currently, we are booked out on weekend Mass intentions for the next nine months, which certainly does not please those who are looking to schedule a Mass intention soon, or even in the summer. On the other hand, other parishes in our diocese have openings, even in the next week they cannot fill. What's happening here? Allow me please to explain the purpose of Mass intentions to maybe help a bit.

When someone dies and their soul is judged by God, we always believe they are now in a "better place"; they are now in Heaven. However, none of us is the judge; God is the only judge of each and every one of our souls. The judgement can be one of three options: Heaven, Hell, or Purgatory. The first two options are clear, but a bit of explanation of Purgatory may help us to understand what Mass intentions all are about.

First, please understand this: Purgatory is not a place, but rather a process of being perfected. After all, Heaven is perfect, so everyone and everything there IS perfect. Actually, my hope is to be granted Purgatory, as it means that at some point, I will be in Heaven! If a soul is experiencing Purgatory, our prayers will help speed them to Heaven, and one of the best ways is to have a Mass prayed for them. This topic is complicated, but I'll leave it at that for now.

We notified the Diocese of our challenge, and they are allowing us to add an additional intention for two of our weekend Masses, so we have chosen the 8:00 and 10:00 Masses. The \$20 stipend that is asked for those Masses will be donated to the diocesan priests' retirement fund, so not only will you have the Mass said for your loved one, but you will be supporting our priests as well.

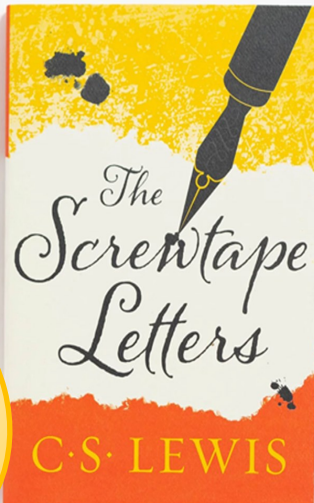

EXTRAORDINARY
 by Deacon Bill

Advent is past history and the Christmas season is over. Once again, we've come to that time of the year that the Church labels as Ordinary Time. This long liturgical season celebrates no major feast and the color green that is used for the ministers' vestments is supposed to remind us that this is a season of growth.

I think it's interesting that this "ordinary" season starts out with a gospel reading that is far from ordinary. John tells us the story of Jesus' first public miracle, the changing of water into wine at a wedding that would have been a flop if he hadn't intervened. Either the hosts hadn't planned very well or their guests were a bunch of heavy drinkers, but regardless of the reason, the wine ran out and they needed help.

Other than the fact that they're both liquid, there's really no comparison between water and wine. So what Jesus did for the wedding couple was truly extraordinary. He took something very common, very ordinary and made it into something very special. Most of us take water for granted. We drink it. We bathe with it. We clean stuff with it. It's just always around. Wine, on the other hand, has a richness, a flavor and can be intoxicating at worst but pleasant at best.

So, is this just another of Jesus' miracles to read about or is there a lesson here for us? If the presence of Jesus can make something so ordinary into something so special, so extraordinary, what can he do with our ordinary lives if we allow him to be part of us? The miracle at Cana began with an invitation to Jesus to join the celebration. I don't know how excited Jesus was to attend that wedding but I do know that he's anxious and ready to become part of our lives, ordinary as they might seem, and to fill us with a richness that is better than we could imagine, if only we invite him.

Ordinary time? Not a chance.
