

Deacon Jeff's Corner

We have all heard the term, "It must be God's will." What exactly is "God's will"? If you are looking for a definitive answer, you need to read no further. However, I hope to give a bit of clarity on this topic.

Whether you are thinking about something major, such as a terminal illness or serious accident, or something rather insignificant, like a virus or injury that prevent you from something you were planning, God's will is involved. In fact, God's will is a part of everything in our lives. Every breath we take, the talents (or lack of) we have, are God's will. There are however two types of God's will: positive will and permissive will. We need to understand the difference between the two.

God's positive will basically means what God wants for us and the entire world. In a perfect world, we would love God with all our heart, mind and soul, and everyone as ourselves. It is always good and never evil. Wouldn't that be great? Of course, but God also allows us permissive (free) will, and this is where things get messy.

Permissive will is what God allows: bad choices, sinful behavior. You name it and within reason, God allows it. Even the heinous acts, such as war, terrorism, serious disagreements and more are allowed, but certainly not preferred by God. Again, this is where many (including me) can sometimes misunderstand God. It's very easy to blame God for the bad things that happen, but much of what happens is the result of our bad choices, our human frailty. However, the only reason we are able to make such choices is because God willed to give us free will.

I am convinced that what we cannot make sense of here on earth will become crystal clear on our judgement day. God's will **is** perfect, but this comes down to trust. I ask you to reflect on this question: How much do you *trust in God*? It is on every single piece of currency you use, so take a hard look at that phrase sometime!



HERE WE GO by Deacon Bill

As the Christmas season comes to an end, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. By now most of us probably have our Christmas trees taken down and our decorations put away. For Christians, the season that is ending has hopefully reminded us that our God, our of great love for us, became a tiny infant so that we could know that love.

I think it's interesting that this feast comes during a time when we've been thinking of Jesus as a baby. It's obvious that, unlike our current practices, we see the adult Jesus coming to John the Baptist for baptism. On top of that, John's baptism was a baptism of repentance and we know that Jesus had nothing to repent. So what's going on here?

It is very clear that, up to this time, Jesus wasn't really a public figure. Scripture tells us very little about him between the time of his birth and the event of his baptism. From this point on, however, we see Jesus gathering disciples, teaching, healing, forgiving sins and basically becoming the Jesus that we have come to know as the very presence of God in human form, although that's who he was all along.


As Jesus' baptism was what I would call the "official starting point" of his public ministry, what does any of this have to do with most of us who went through baptism when we were too little to know about it? I would suggest that our baptism, even if it was something done so long ago, should be the starting point for us to continue the ministry he began. Babies and children are just that. We can teach them and help form them but someday, hopefully, they grow and become someone who can decide for themselves what life is all about. If part of that growth includes discovering that our own baptism, even though we can't remember it, was a calling from God to bring the Good News to our world as it was for Jesus, and if we accept that calling, our mission should be clear. So, here we go.
